Fuel sales were up in April 47% over March. Fuel sales year over year from last April were up 20%. The increases are attributed to Jet A sales. This was the best fuel sales month since we started operations in May 2019.

We flew 187.6 hours on the flight training aircraft in Crossville in March, which was up almost 12% from March. This was another record month for KCSV flight training. The simulator should be showing up this month and will have a positive impact on flight training and activity since it will be a unique training asset for pilots in this area.

We took delivery of the first Tecnam P2008 a few weeks ago. This aircraft will be based in Shelbyville and used for training, demo/ sales flights and rental.

Brenton and Brantley attended Tecnam training at the factory assembly facility in Sebring Florida. I received training in all the Tecnam models from the Chief Flight Instructor from Capua Italy where there manufacturing facility and headquarters is based. We delivered an additional aircraft to a customer in West TN last week with two more deliveries scheduled in May. The Crossville maintenance base will be the service center for these aircraft.

Fuel costs / prices show no signs of abating with the price of oil holding above \$100 per barrel. It has yet to slow down fuel sales. The overall economic outlook is not favorable heading into the second half of 2022. My hope is that Tennessee will fare better than most of the country due to the influx of wealth moving to the state from other states.
