

Maintenance continues to be busy and we are at capacity based on our staffing. We are actively looking for an additional mechanic. Two of our mechanics (Brenton and Brandon) will receive their Airframe and Powerplant Certifications in January.

We did not get to do the plane rides at the open house event due to high winds that exceeded the limits of our airplanes. We will look for a Saturday before winter time that will have good weather to reschedule and just do an all day plane ride day for the community.
