

Fuel sales were off in December over November and also significantly down year over year. We had significant weather in the last 7 days of the year that slowed flying down. All of the Jet Fuel sales decline was with based customers at the airport who were not flying in December like they did last year. Avgas held steady even with the bad weather.

We flew 153 hours in Crossville for flight training. Training activity continues to remain strong at Crossville. This was down from previous months but expected since we had a significant amount of non-flying days in December.

Maintenance continues to be busy. We are starting two CCHS interns this week in our shop. Brenton will obtain his Airframe Certification at the end of this month and will then be a full A&P. Brandon is going to Bakers School in Nashville in February and will come back with his A&P license. We are hiring an additional mechanic this month, who is an experienced A&P and IA, with significant turbine experience. This will allow us to expand the aircraft we work on to include single and twin turbine aircraft over the coming 12 months.
