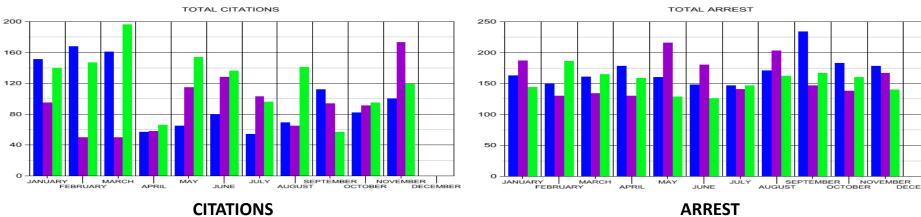


CROSSVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT STAT COMPARISONS YEAR TO YEAR— JUNE 2024

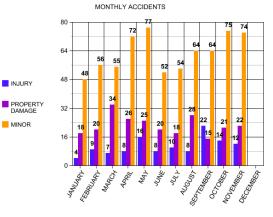

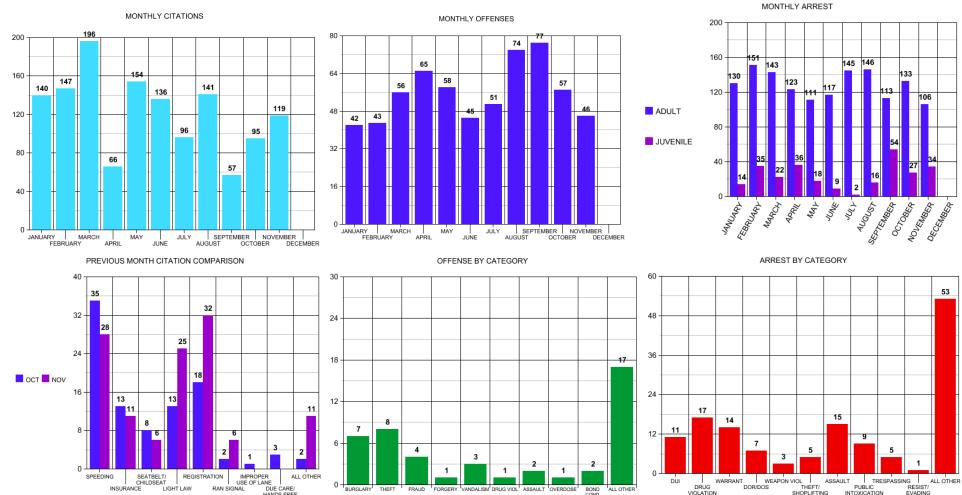

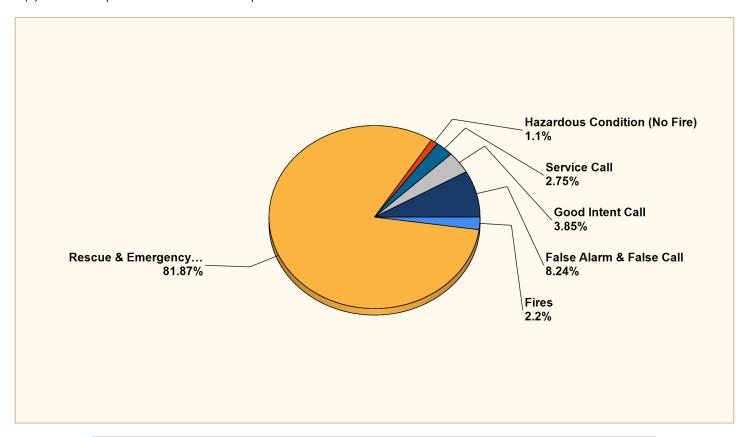

Fuel sales were down in November over October and down from last November 2023. We don't have anything specific to attribute to the change in fuel sales month over month. We anticipate an increase in Jet A fuel sales over the next year with an addition of two turbine aircraft based at CSV and Mastercorp adding a Jet back to their fleet.

The maintenance shop remains busy and fully booked.

The instrument approaches to Runway 26 will be fully operational for night approaches with the release of the next update of Navigation Data from the FAA on December 26. This was a result of the repairs being completed for the runway approach lights. Additionally, we anticipate the approval of an instrument approach procedure for Runway 8 in the next update that will allow aircraft to descend to 250 above touchdown. This has been in the works for several years and will be welcomed by transient and based pilots. This will have a big impact on aircraft being able to operate out of CSV on low ceiling days where the winds favor runway 8.
